



WHAT HAPPENS AT WOOLFLANDS DAYCARE?

Nemacolin Wooflands All Day Play program provides a safe, leash-free environment for “approved” dogs to play, run and bark all day. Please note the following items if your dog attends daycare:

- Dogs who are not used to high levels of activity or playing within groups sometimes take time to adjust to such activity. Fatigue, sore paws, excessive thirst or sore muscles are common signs.
- Dogs are pack animals and have internal instincts. They play with their teeth and paws like kids play with their hands and feet. Therefore, even under professional supervision, nicks, scrapes and occasional puncture wounds do happen. In the event of injury, we will contact you immediately, or if minor, we will advise you at the time of departure.
 - All Day Play’s leash-free environment allows dogs the opportunity to play in close physical contact with each other. Similar to kids who share a classroom, this contact increases the risks for the spread of communicable disease. Even though Nemacolin Wooflands number one goal is a healthy and safe environment, no amount of sanitation, pre-screening or vaccination requirement can be 100% effective against the spread of communicable illnesses.
- Some dogs need “time outs” on occasion. If they get too aggressive or excited, they may need to be separated from the pack for a period of time to settle down. We practice the “time out” policy to keep control and to minimize any unforeseen problems or injuries. For safety and aggression concerns, dogs who are fed during All Day Play hours will only be fed in “time out.”
- Similar to children, dogs at play do get dirty. Weather conditions can add to this. We make every effort to send your dog home as clean as possible. You may schedule a bath prior to your dog’s departure time.
 - Water is always available for the dogs, however; your dog may be too excited or distracted to remember to drink on a regular basis. Some dogs may try and make up for this when returning home. Remember, excessive water intake or even eating, may cause an upset stomach or lead to other problems. If you are worried about your dog’s water intake, please consult your vet with any questions you may have.
